The 24-hour Critical Care Unit provides dedicated, continuous and specialised care.

Our multi-disciplinary team is comprised of experienced medical experts across a range of specialties in complex surgeries and acute care.

The Critical Care Unit is supported by medical facilities offered at London Bridge Hospital, providing an unrivalled level of patient support.

CRITICAL CARE UNIT

London Bridge Hospital delivers a full range of tertiary care for patients.

Our highly specialised Critical Care Unit allows us to achieve an unrivalled level of acute care and support for medical patients and complex surgical cases.

The 12-bedded unit provides Level 2 and 3 critical care in three strategic locations within the main hospital building. The London Bridge Hospital Critical Care Unit delivers dedicated, continuous and specialised care to critically ill patients with a variety of medical or surgical conditions requiring complex multi-organ support.

MULTI-DISCIPLINARY TEAM

The Critical Care Unit is staffed by a dynamic and motivated multi-disciplinary team, with Consultant Intensivists providing 24-hour cover. This allows for comprehensive and uninterrupted consultant care at all times.

The Consultant Intensivist is supported by a Critical Care Resident Medical Officer (CCRMO) qualified to Anaesthetic Registrar level equivalent. The CCRMO is on site 24 hours a day. There is a qualified Critical Care Nurse, with Advanced Life Support qualifications, on duty at all times.

The remainder of the multi-disciplinary team includes pharmacists, physiotherapists, dietitians and nurses who specialise in the management of acute pain.



CRITICAL CARE UNIT SERVICES

The multi-disciplinary team provide a number of additional services, crucial to critical care. These include:

- Non-invasive and advanced mechanical ventilation
- Modern continuous haemodynamic monitoring systems
- Different modalities of renal replacement therapy

The unit also specialises in weaning from mechanical ventilators and has access and availability to the latest diagnostic technologies and drug therapies.
